



## **Roles of Management Team**

- 1. Director/Manager of the Incubation Centre: This person is in charge of the general management and operations of the Incubation Centre. They make that the centre operates successfully and efficiently by supervising its operational operations, financial management, and strategic planning.
- 2. Programme Coordinator: The programme coordinator is in charge of creating and carrying out different projects and programmes to assist the incubation centre's companies. To comprehend the demands of the start-ups, they collaborate closely with them.

- 8. Human Resources Manager: The manager of human resources is in charge of hiring, developing, and training employees at the incubation centre. Additionally, they assist start-ups with human resource-related issues.
